## **TOUR SUMMARY**

Mexico is vast and diverse, and the Yucatan Peninsula is a very different from the rest of the country. It's a huge shelf of limestone that divides the Gulf of Mexico from the Caribbean. This is a still-sparsely populated area that has large areas of pristine forest, and an abundance of wildlife. Not only does this area hold a great set of Central American forest species, but it also has a solid set of its own endemics. These include a few species and subspecies that are restricted to the island of Cozumel, on the Caribbean side of the peninsula.

This was a fun and successful trip, for a small and flexible group. We found all the endemic birds of Cozumel and Yucatan, save for the Yucatan Gnatcatcher. One of these was the fabulous Ocellated Turkey shown on the cover photo. Other avian highlights included American Flamingo, Blue Ground-Dove, Mangrove Cuckoo, Russet-naped Wood-Rail, Boat-billed Heron, Crane Hawk, Turquoise-browed Motmot, Keel-billed Toucan, Collared Forest-Falcon, Mayan Antthrush, Red-capped Manakin, Northern Schiffornis, and Long-billed Gnatwren. We visited and birded several wonderful Mayan sites, from the popular Chichen Itza to the remote and little-known Hormiguero. The food on this trip was wonderful throughout. We enjoyed many tasty field breakfasts, which

included fresh mango, papaya, avocados, and tostados! And the restaurant food was great too, ranging from Mexico staples like *tacos al pastor* to delicious local seafood dishes.
